REMEMBER

[God] will cover you with His feathers; you will take refuge under His wings. His faithfulness will be a protective shield. – Psalm 91:4

READ

Psalm 91:1-16. The Bible says that God is in charge, so we can feel safe. Sure, we'll still stump our toes, think bad thoughts, and get sick—we live in a broken world. But when we choose to trust Jesus, we're never alone, and God has a great adventure planned for our lives.

THINK

- 1. What scares Oliver?
- 2. What scares you?
- 3. Have you ever had to deal with a bully like Doyle? What happened?
- 4. Name a fear that has kept you from doing something you know you should do.
- 5. God is perfect. What about Him can you focus on when you are afraid?

DO

Make your own protective wings.

- 1. Get two sheets of paper. Construction paper or cardstock is best, but any paper will do.
- 2. On each sheet of paper, draw (or ask an adult to draw) a large wing.
- 3. On one wing, write: "God will cover you with His feathers; you will take refuge under His wings." On the other wing, write: "God's faithfulness will be a shield." Psalm 91:4
- 4. Cut out (or ask an adult to cut out) your wings. Color or decorate them.
- 5. Hang your wings over your bed, on the refrigerator, or by the door to remind you of God's protection. If you know someone else who is afraid, make them a set of wings too!

Long after your paper wings are gone, God's wings of protection will still be there to shelter you.
