## REMEMBER

### READ

## DO

Chores for the Lord:

- 1. Get a small poster or sheet of paper and markers or crayons.
- 2. Starting at the top left corner, in colorful letters, write the words of Colossians 3:23 around the edges. If you have room, write it again until it creates a full border around the paper. (You may want to try it in pencil first.)
- 3. Within the border, list the chores or tasks that you're suppose to do around the house.
- 4. Hang the list where you can see it each day, as a reminder that you're working for the Lord.
