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**REMEMBER**

**READ**

Read Acts 10:24-28. Peter was one of Jesus' disciples and watched his Master cross cultural barriers. Jesus gave Peter and many others the Great Commission to go and make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:19-20), and Peter had preached to an ethnically diverse crowd on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2). Yet when we get to Acts 10, he is still dividing the Jews and Gentiles according to cultural norms of the day. As God leads Peter to the home of a Gentile named Cornelius, Peter has a defining moment and declares that God has shown him that no race is better than any other (V. 28)

**THINK**

1. Think about all the people you know. How many different skin colors can you count? How many different hair colors? What about eye colors?
2. In the story, Imani and Kayla are best friends. How are they alike? How are they different?
3. Granny Mac reminds the kids in the story that God made each of them special and chose their hair and skin colors. Why do you think God chose the colors He picked especially for you?
4. Close your eyes and imagine what it would be like to be blind. Now open your eyes and imagine you see a world with no color. What would it be like? Do you think a world with no color would be happy or sad? Why?
5. Why do you think God created a world filled with colors? Do you think He made people of different colors for the same reason? Can you think of a way to celebrate our beautifully different skin colors?
6. Think about the meanings of the words blind and full. Would you rather be colorblind or colorfull? Why?
