REMEMBER:

The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky proclaims the work of His hands. –Psalm 19:1

READ:

Read Romans 1:18-20. Have you ever taken a drink of milk that's gone bad? Ugh! Yuck! I love milk, but when it goes sour, there is nothing worse! The Bible explains that the world is kind of like sour milk. It was once really good, but something turned it sour. That's why the apostle Paul said that we now see God's wrath—His disapproval. We can tell that what was once just right has somehow gone bad.

Still, Paul showed us that God has filled the world with clues to point us back to Him and give us reasons to believe in Him. King David said the heavens reveal the glory of God (Psalm 19). But because of our sin—our disobedience to God—we often sense God's wrath instead of thinking about how great He is. But remember, before there was sin, God made the world just right so we could see His power, and He made our hearts just right so we could know His goodness. The Bible promises that one day there will be no more sin or sadness, because God will make everything just right once again.

THINK:

1. God made an amazing world, didn't He? Can you name five ways you see God's power and goodness in creation (Romans 1:20)?
2. What do you think has gone wrong with the world?
3. Because we can sense God's power and goodness in the world, Romans 1:20 says we have no excuse for not believing in Him. Do you think there are any good excuses for not believing in God?
4. Have you ever heard someone say they don't believe in God? Did they say why? If someone asked why you believe in God, what would be your answer?
5. So many things in the world point to God. Can you say a prayer and thank Him for these clues from creation?
