Reflect:

In the verse above, circle the words *created* and *image* each time they appear.

Why do you think it's important to remember that God created all people?

What is another word for image?

What do you think it means to be created in God's image?

Ask Yourself:

Do boys reflect God's image better than girls? Do tall, strong people reflect God's image better than people with disabilities? Do light-skinned people reflect God's image better than darkskinned people?

Let's Go!

Go to the park and spend the day noticing all the colors of creation, including the colors of everyone's skin. Praise God for making His creation so diverse. Thank Him for making people a very special part of His creation—His image-bearers!

Day 2 Loving God and Others!

Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is, Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other command greater than these.—Mark 12:30–32

Reflect:

In the verse above, underline all of the things we're supposed to love God with. That's a lot of things! What's another way you could summarize this command about loving God?

Ask Yourself:

Now think about loving your neighbor as yourself. What are some ways you love yourself? How do you take care of yourself? How do you protect yourself? How might you take care of or protect others—especially those who don't look like you?

Father, so often we love ourselves the most—more than You or others. Change our hearts so that we love You most and then turn around and love others as much as we love ourselves. Amen.

Let's Go!

Go to a part of town where the majority of people don't look like you. Walk around the neighborhood. Play at the park. Eat at one of the local restaurants. Worship God for how He made people different. Ask God to grow your love for people who are different from you.

Day 3 How We Walk with God

Mankind, he has told each of you what is good and what it is the LORD requires of you: to act justly, to love faithfulness, and to walk humbly with your God.—Micah 6:8

Reflect:

Look up the word *just*. What does it mean? What word means the opposite? (*Justice* is seeing needs in the world and doing something about them.)

Look up the word *faithfulness*. What does it mean? What word means the opposite? (*Faithfulness* is being full of faith in God. It's doing what God asks of you because you believe He will keep His promises.)

Look up the word *humility*. What does it mean? What word means the opposite? (*Humility* is knowing your place in the world—below God and beside others.)

How is God asking you to show *justice*, *faithfulness*, or *humility* this week?




Jesus, help us be people who are full of faith and who love others as much as ourselves. Forgive us when we act in ways opposite to this. Amen.

Ask Yourself:

Do you want to walk with God? Sometimes when you walk with God, He will ask you to go places you might not want to because He wants you to be a person of justice, faithfulness, and humility. Do you want to do go wherever God leads?

Is there a need in your community that your family can help fill? Research people or groups who are already doing something about it, and join in with them.

Day 4 Oracle Control Contro

Therefore produce fruit consistent with repentance. ... "What then should we do?" the crowds were asking him. He replied to them, "The one who has two shirts must share with someone who has none, and the one who has food must do the same." Tax collectors also ... asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He told them, "Don't collect any more than what you have been authorized." Some soldiers also questioned him, "What should we do?" He said to them, "Don't take money from anyone by force or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages." —Luke 3:8,11–15

Reflect:

Repentance is turning away from sin and turning toward God. The people asked John, "What must we do to repent?" John gave three different answers. What were they?

What do the answers have in common?

How does our repentance impact how we treat others?



Ask Yourself:

Jesus, teach us to not take advantage of other people, but to be generous instead. Help us repent of sin and love others more! Amen.

Are there certain people you tend to treat better than others? Maybe your friends? Maybe the popular kids? Maybe people who look, talk, or act like you? If anyone comes to mind who you tend to treat worse, repent of this. Ask God to uproot that sin from your heart and plant seeds of love, generosity, and more there instead.

Let's Go!

Spend some time in your yard or a public park this week uprooting weeds. Talk about why it's important to uproot sin in your heart through repentance. Do you need to repent for anything specific today, especially when it comes to how you treat other people?

Day 5 Of Civing and Receiving!

Little children, let us not love in word or speech, but in action and in truth. —1 John 3:18

Reflect:

Does the verse above mean we should never say we love people? Not at all. Instead, the Bible is pointing out that if we only love people through our words, our love is incomplete.

Has someone ever said they loved you and then turned around and hurt you? Or did they say they cared and then ignored you? How did that make you feel?



Jesus, help us learn how to love with our words and our actions. Help us learn to both give and receive love in action. Amen.

Ask Yourself:

True love is about giving *and* receiving love. Is there someone who looks (or speaks or acts) differently from you who you need to show love to through action? Or is there someone who looks (or speaks or acts) differently from you whose love you need to gladly receive?

Let's Go!

Pick three people you love. Think about how they are different from you (age, skin color, gender, etc.) and thank God for making them the way He did. Then do something special to show them how much you love them.

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
