



And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.—Philippians 1:6

Read:

Read Psalm 27:14. God has an amazing purpose and plan for your life that often requires waiting. The Master, who is God, is molding you in ways you may not be able see, to do things you can't even imagine, and to touch lives in ways you may never know. But God's plan is often realized through much growth and time. Just like a bamboo seed takes years to become a full bamboo stalk and serve the purpose for which it was designed, it may take a long time for you to see fully who God designed you to be. Psalm 27:14 reminds us to wait for the Lord and trust His perfect timing.

Think:

- 1. Bamboo seeds are made when a parent bamboo flowers, which only happens once every thirty to 120 years! It then takes another three to five years for the seed to generate and mature. That's a long time! What dreams do you have that may take a long time?
- 2. Bamboo is used in many ways: as food, medicine, and to build homes. Each purpose helps and blesses others. Can you name three special traits God is growing in you? Are you a kind helper, a good leader, or great at making people smile?
- 3. The bamboo sprout had lots to share, but he didn't want to at first. The moon helped him realize that this was part of the Master's plan for his life—to give what he had to help others. What gifts can you use to bless others as you grow? For example, do you enjoy making music, drawing, helping bake?
- 4. In the story, the moon reminds the bamboo seed to be patient and that the Master (God) has a plan. Who in your life reminds you to keep looking to God? Say a prayer of thanks for that person, and ask God to help you be patient and trust in Him.
